Subject: Regarding the class 12th board examination

Respected Sir,

It is requested that in the present scenario, the safety of students is paramount for all of us, but it is also very important to worry about their future. The result of class 12 examination cannot be given on the basis of the result of class X examination. The result of class X examination is mostly used as a proof of date of birth, while the result of class XII determines the future of the child. Declaring the results without the main examination can also be a threat to the future opportunities of higher education for students, scholarship from home and abroad and preference in competitive examinations. All students will be seen as promoted students, so deserving students may face mental problems. Following are the suggestions of the Akhil Bhartiya Rashtriya shaikshik mahasangh in this regard -

- Board examination should be held in the student's own school, so that he or she need not to go out unnecessarily.
- Like vaccination centers, examination centers can be easily managed by the state governments.
- All the safety rules of COVID-19 at the examination centers should be strictly adhered to.
- Examination should be of only in three subjects and language paper, chosen by the student himself.
- The question paper should be of one to one and a half hours time, and in place of long answer questions, short answer questions be set in the examination.
- Any student who has difficulty or inconvenience to appear in the examination, they should be given separate opportunity.
- Students should be provided sample paper at least one month in advance, so that they can prepare themselves as per the guidelines given in this sample paper. Therefore, board examinations may be conducted in the month of July or August.

The Akhil Bhartiya Rashtriya Shaikshik Mahasangh believes that the arrangements for the examination should be made taking into consideration the safety and future of the students.
